Palestine (Arabic: Filasīn; Greek:
Palaistinē; Latin: Palaestina;
Hebrew: Palestina) is a conventional
name used to describe the region
between the Mediterranean Sea and
the Jordan River. The term Peleset
(from hieroglyphs as P-r-s-t) is
found in Egyptian documents
referring to a neighboring people or
land starting from c.1150 BCE.
