A.D. 680: Imam Hussein, grandson of the Prophet Muhammad, was decapitated at the Battle of Karbala. He died after claiming the right to become the caliph upon the death of Caliph Muawiya. Muawiya's son, Yazid, also claimed the caliphate and battle broke out. It marked the breakaway of Shiites from Sunni Islam. The day of Hussein's death is commemorated as Ashura by Shiite Muslms.

For centuries before its collapse in 612 BC, Assyria controlled the plains between the Tigris and Euphrates, flat, semiarid, hardto-defend terrain that is the most often fought-over patch of real estate on the planet, and that is remarkably similar to the IS's domain. Assyria's rival and nemesis was Babylon, a kingdom now held by the Shia government in Baghdad.
